The Tamborine Mountain Botanic Gardens were formed in 1982 by the Tamborine Mountain Garden Club Inc, at the suggestion of the Beaudesert Shire Council. The land was Lantana-covered with the Tamborine Creek flowing through. The land was cleared by Volunteers, the lake and stone bridge built, and plantings of native and exotic species undertaken. Over the years with the help of the Council, and successive groups of Volunteers, the Gardens have evolved into their present unique blend of Sub-tropical Rainforest and carefully planned exotic species. These Botanic Gardens are a tribute to those helpers who are currently nurturing them and those who have made their mark in the past.

## Open Gardens Trail

This annual event is held in late September or early October and runs from Friday to Sunday. Open Gardens, Garden Club Plant and Jam Stalls, local and visiting Nurseries, Food, Music and Local Produce.

The Tamborine Mountain Garden Club Inc hosts 'Springtime on the Mountain' to raise the funds necessary to continue the work of developing and maintaining these Botanic Gardens. The first 'Springtime' was held in 1983 and is now so popular it attracts thousands of visitors to the mountain.

The Trail is very clearly signposted and visitors are able to purchase Trail Passes at the Botanic Gardens or any Open Garden over the 3 days. Coach/Bus Groups can be catered for but bookings are essential.

# Take the time to...

Explore the incomparable Tamborine Mountain Botanic Gardens, unique for the fact that they have been developed by Volunteers and also for the blend of both Tropical and Temperate plants.

**Stroll** the Boardwalk amongst Tropical Rainforest Palms and pause in the Thai Sala to appreciate the beauty of the Lake

**Picnic** on the lawns around the Lake or in the Tropical Palm Grove or covered Eating area

**Relax** under the magnificent Wisteria-covered pergolas or take in the floral panoramas from the Rotunda

**Admire** the many prominent planting areas throughout the Gardens featuring Azaleas, Bromeliads, Camellias, Hydrangeas, Magnolias, Maples, Rhododendrons, Roses, Viburnums and many more

**Hike** the hillside Rainforest Walk and move amongst the original Piccabeen Palms and remnant Cedars which once covered the Mountain.

**Enjoy** the beautiful Cherry Tree Walk which flowers mid October. The trees were gifted, in a gesture of friendship and goodwill by the Gifu Sakura no Kai Group in Japan in 2003
